A year-end check presentation at C2C's new West Conshohocken warehouse highlighted the nonprofit's work to provide **low-income and homeless children** from **birth to pre-teen** the **essentials** they need to be **safe, warm, ready to learn and valued**, all **free of charge** through partnerships with **550+ agencies** throughout the five county-area. Since its opening in 2007, **over 46,000 youth** have benefitted from C2C's work.

The **inspiration** behind this event and the donation **came from a lawsuit** handled by the firm related to the employment contract of an area teacher.
